To be able to talk about ECMCs with a sense of understanding



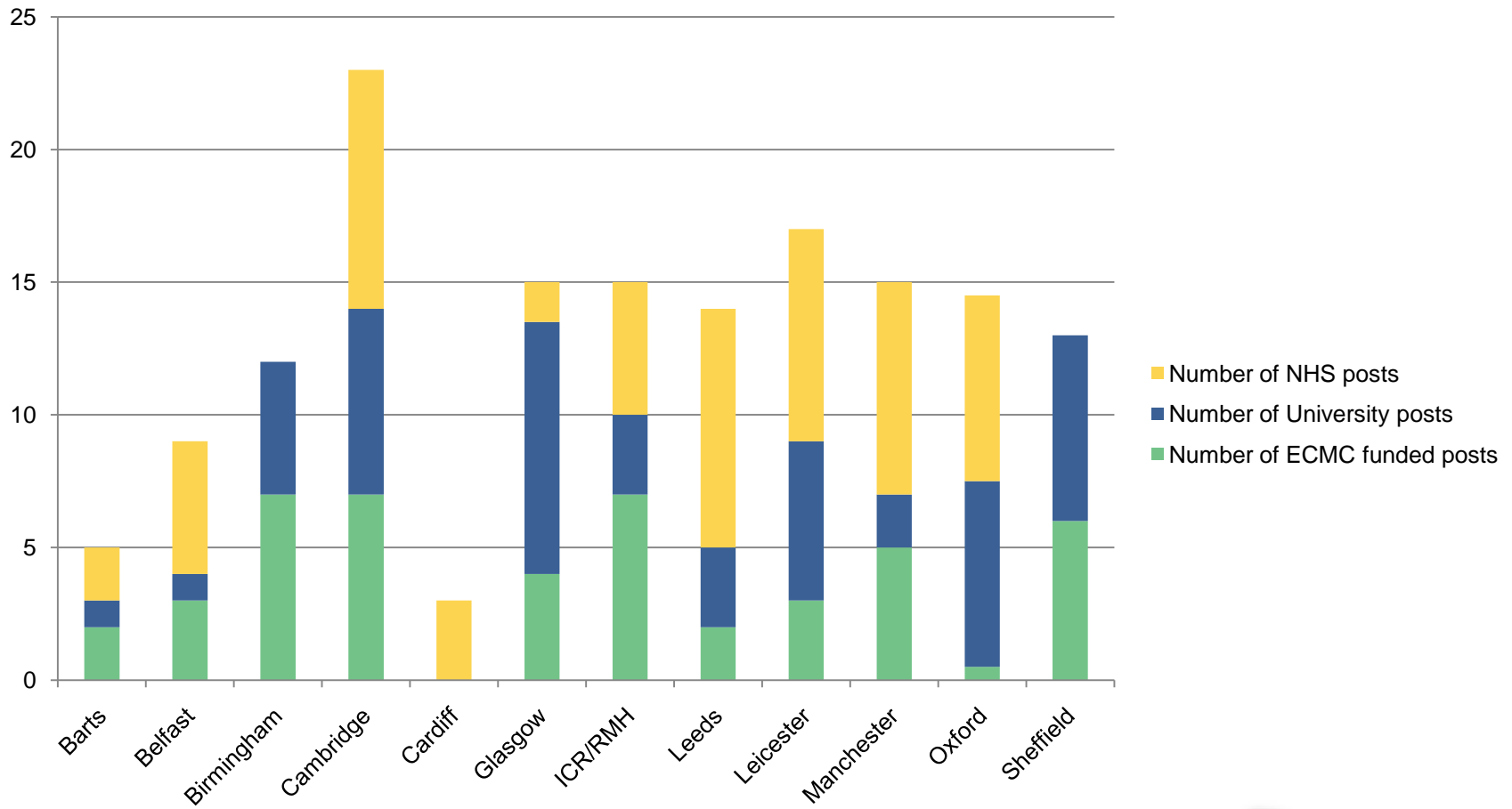
What did we ask?

- Each ECMC was asked to complete a spreadsheet indicating the different job titles used within their ECMC and the different tasks undertaken by each title
- Also where they had dedicated research space and which staff were University v NHS employees

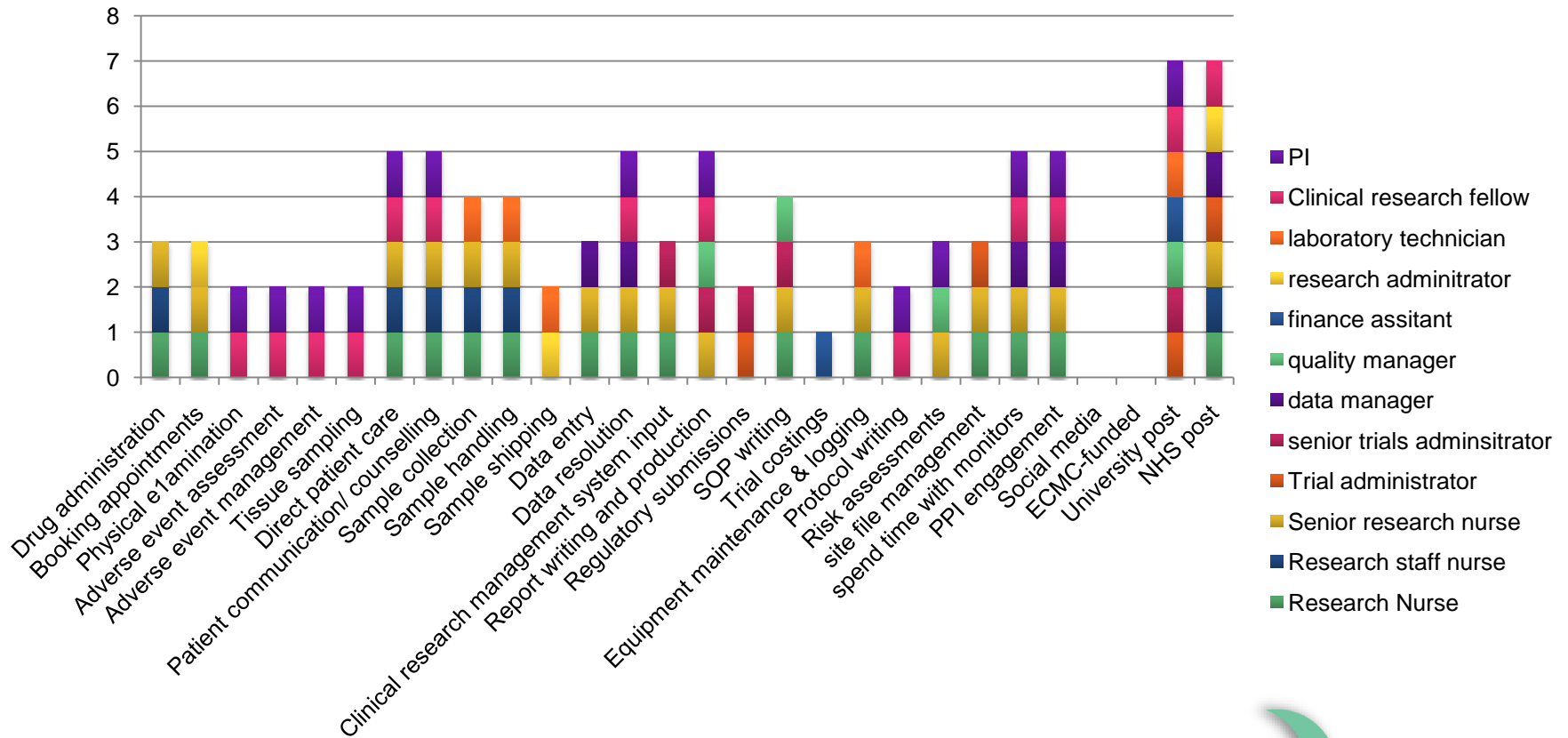
Responses

- 12 centres completed the survey and submitted data
- 11 reported on available space
- 8 had access to a Clinical Research Facility
- Number of beds ranged from 2 -16
- Number of chairs ranged from 5 – 16
- 2 centres indicated difficulty in accessing space as required

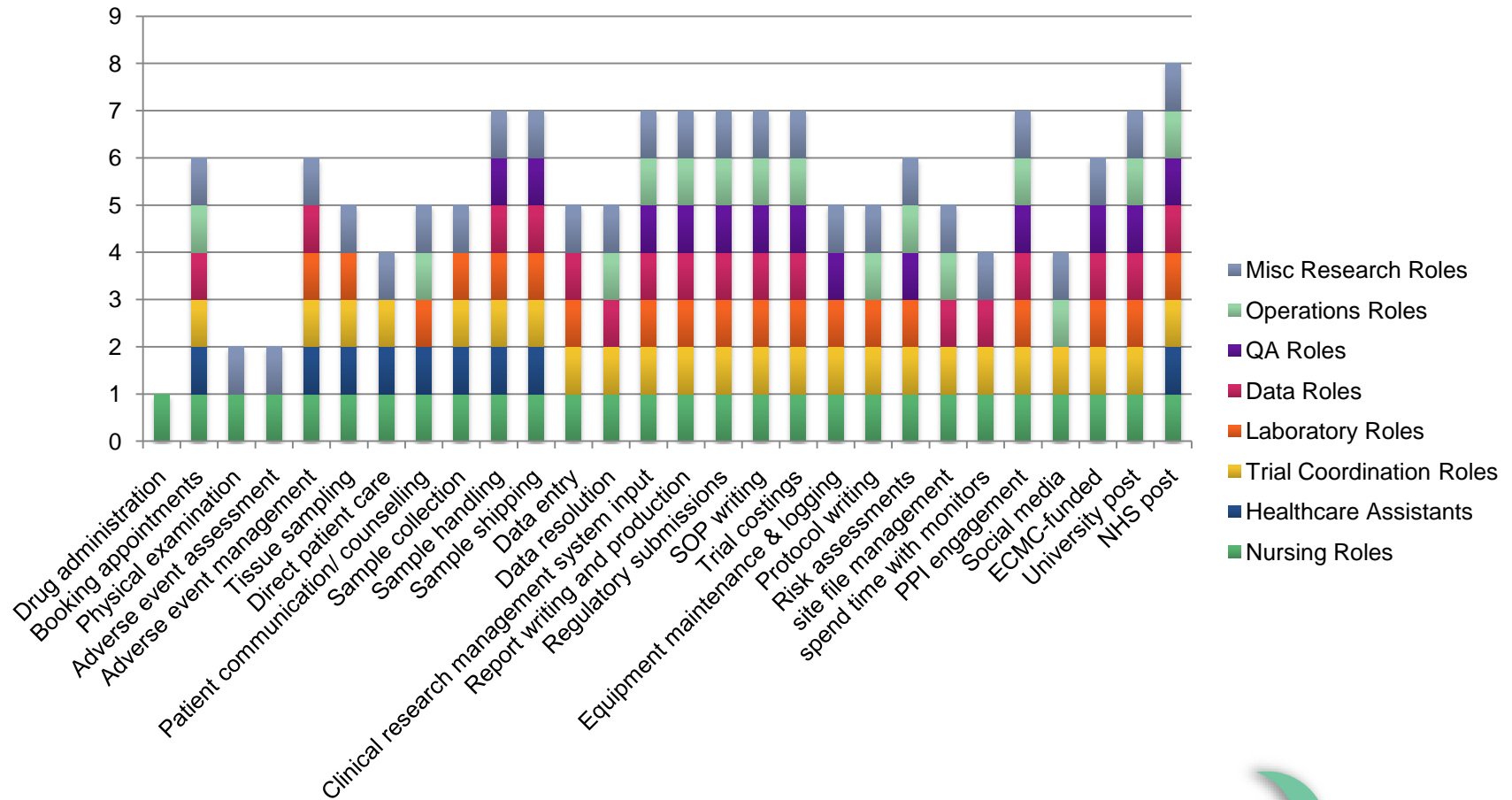

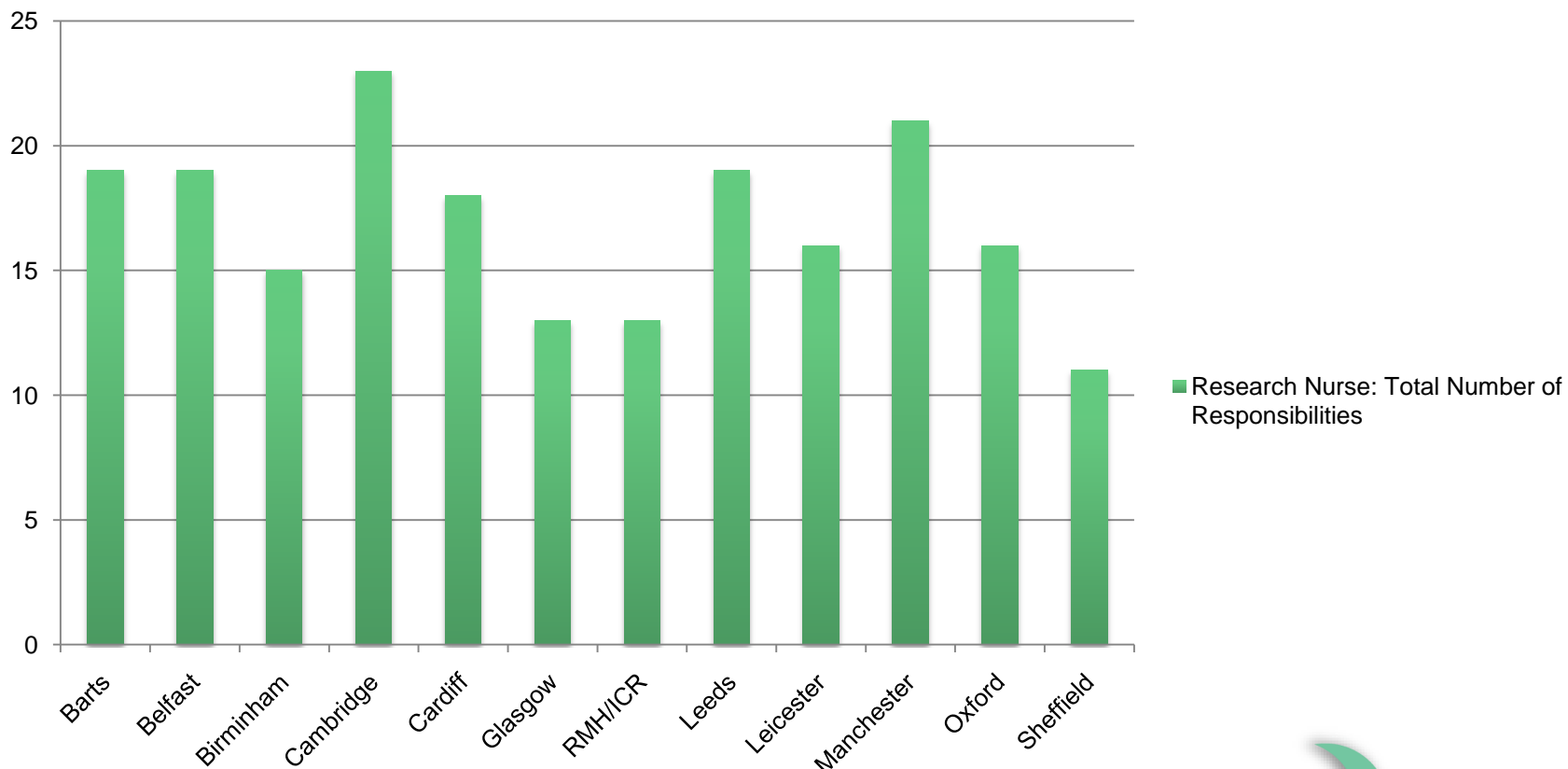
Job roles



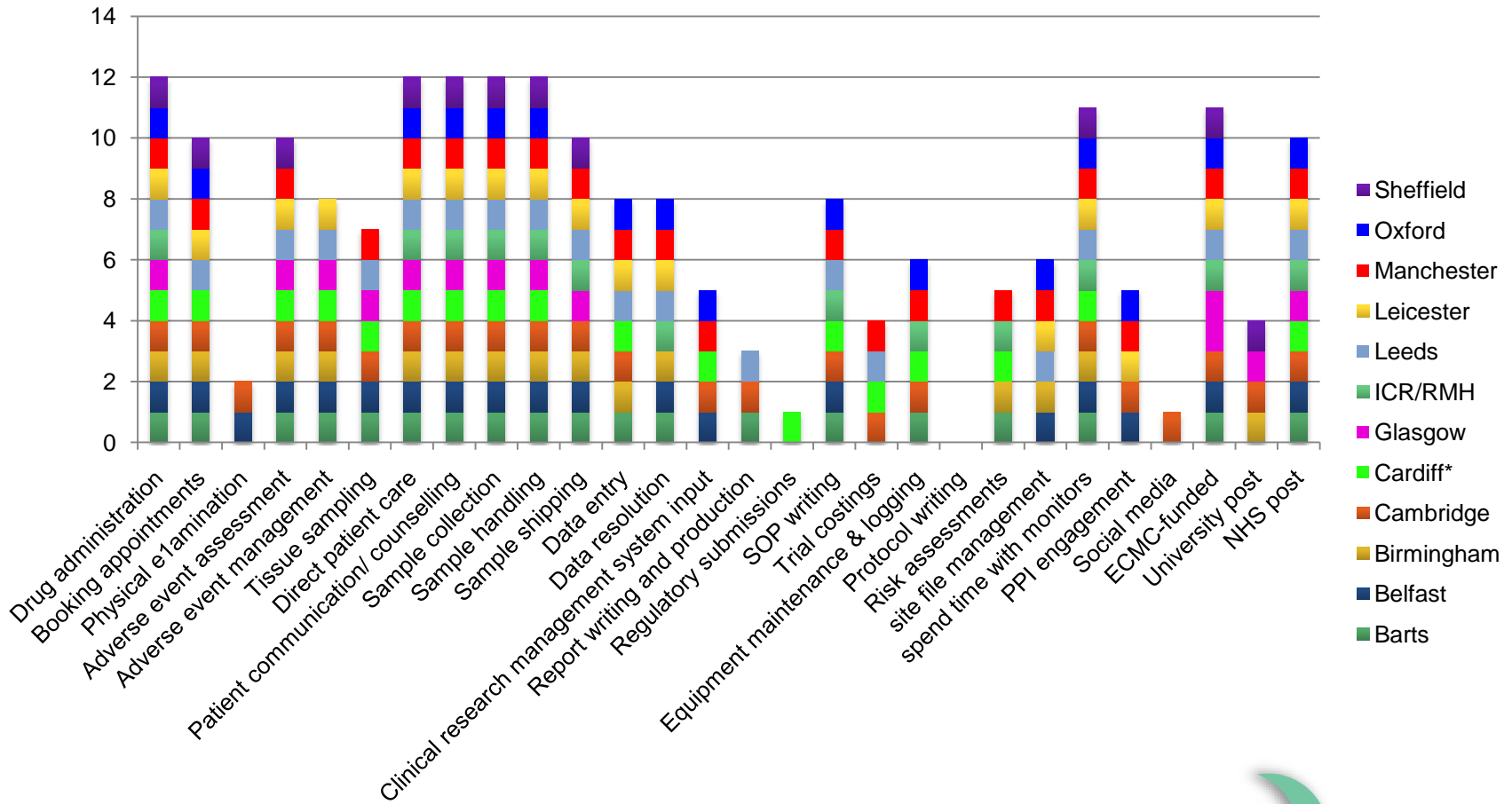
Job roles 2



Research Nurse: Total Number of Responsibilities

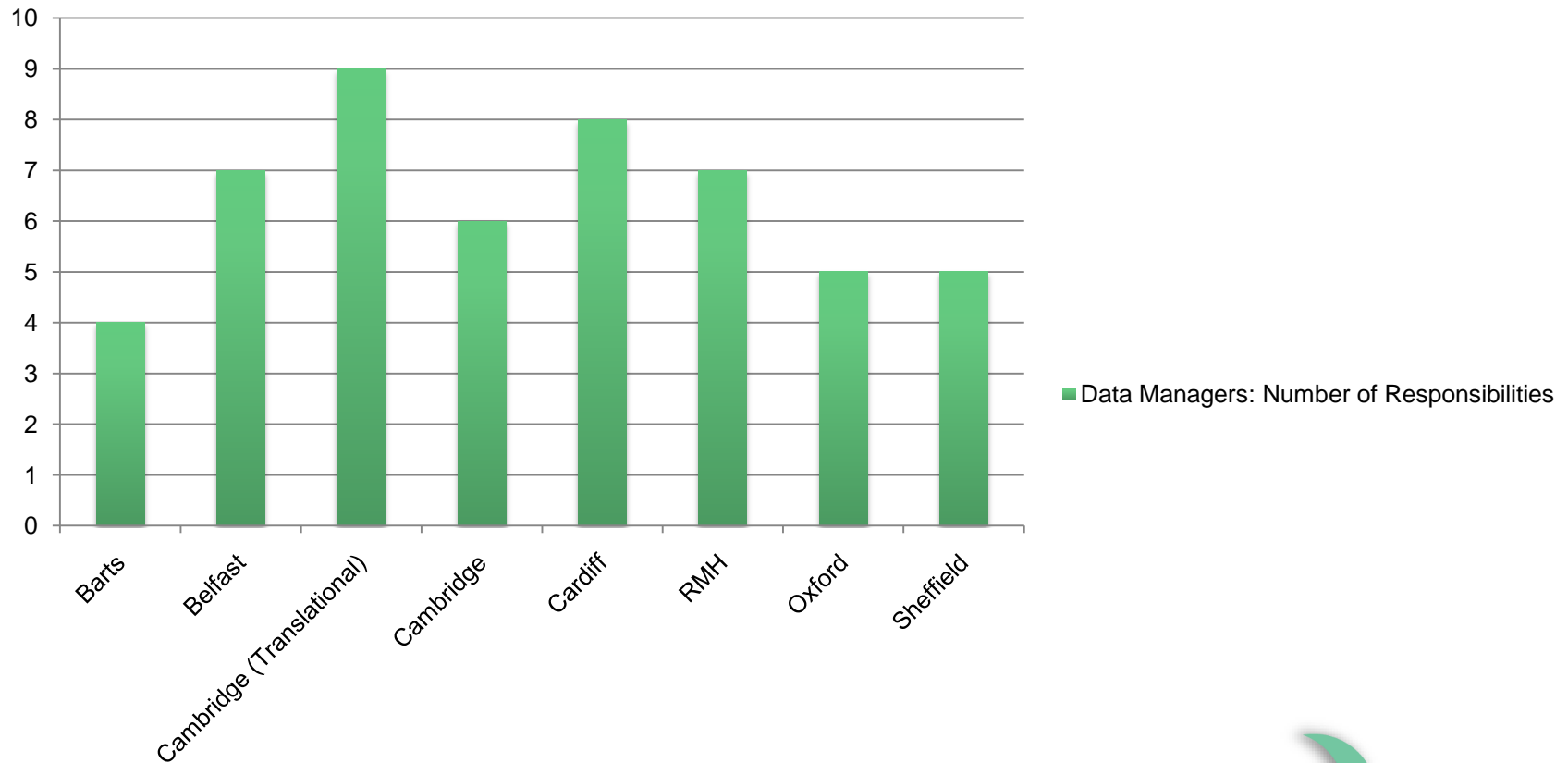


Research Nurse Responsibilities

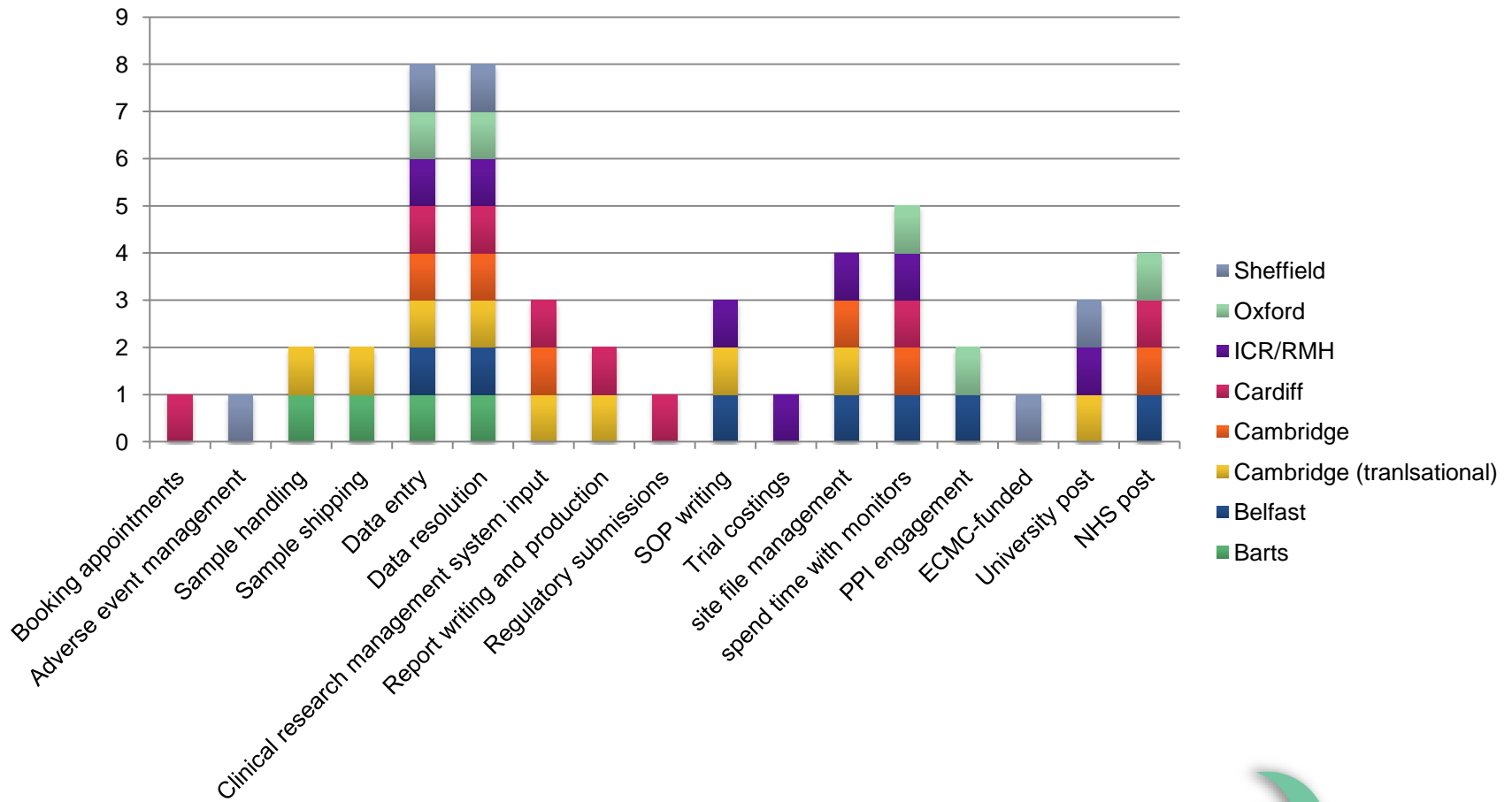

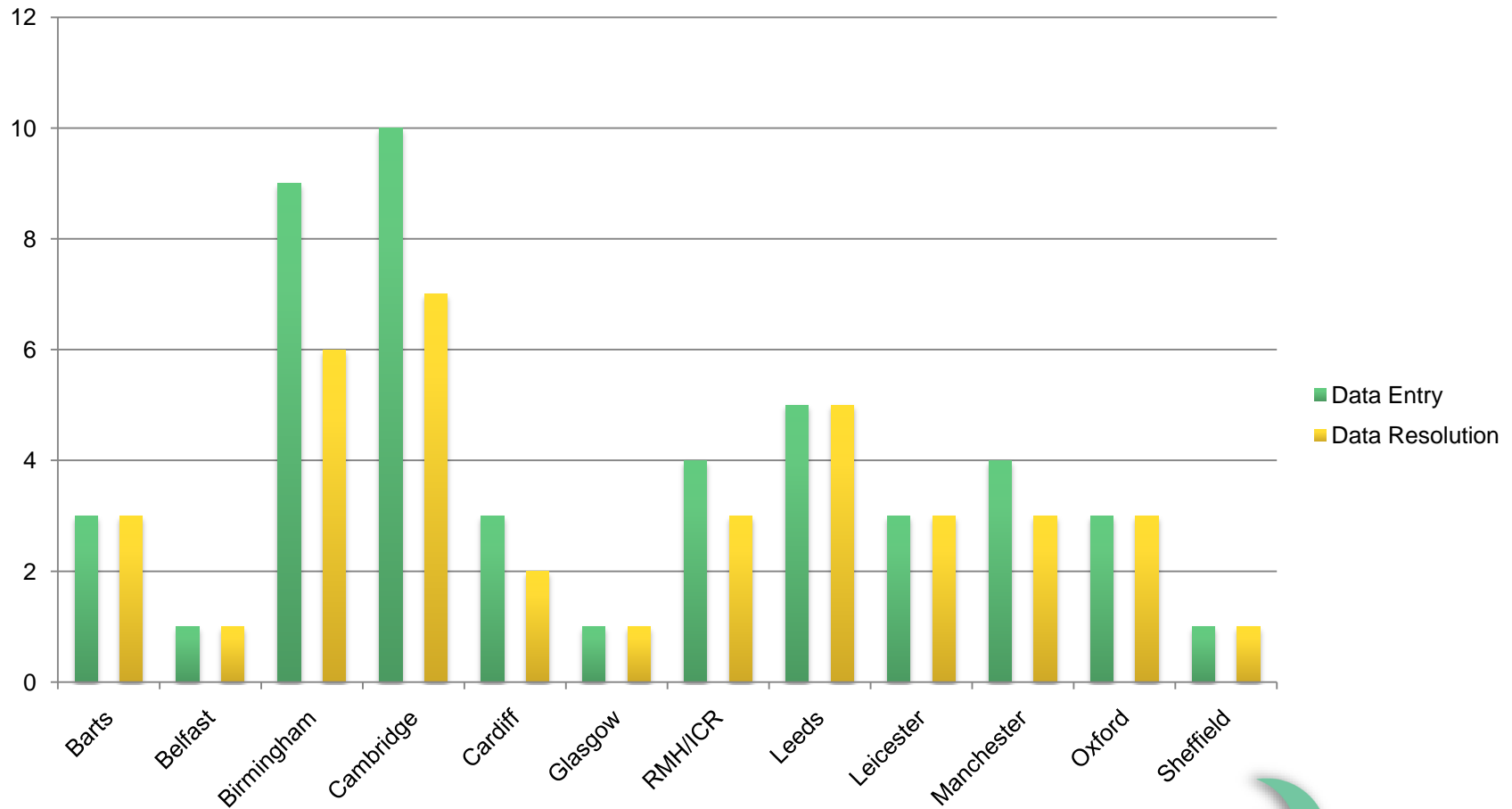
Data Managers: Number of Responsibilities



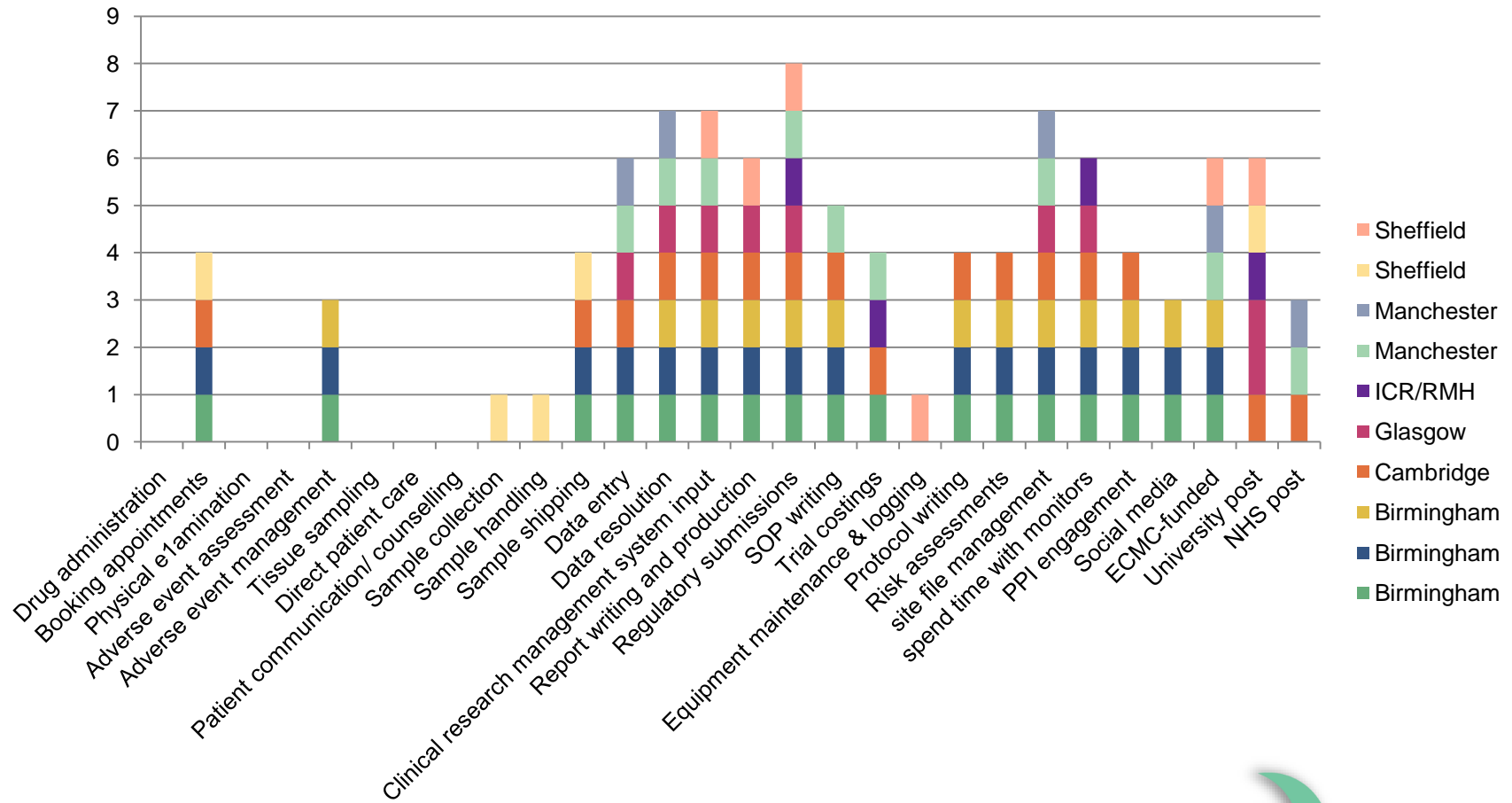

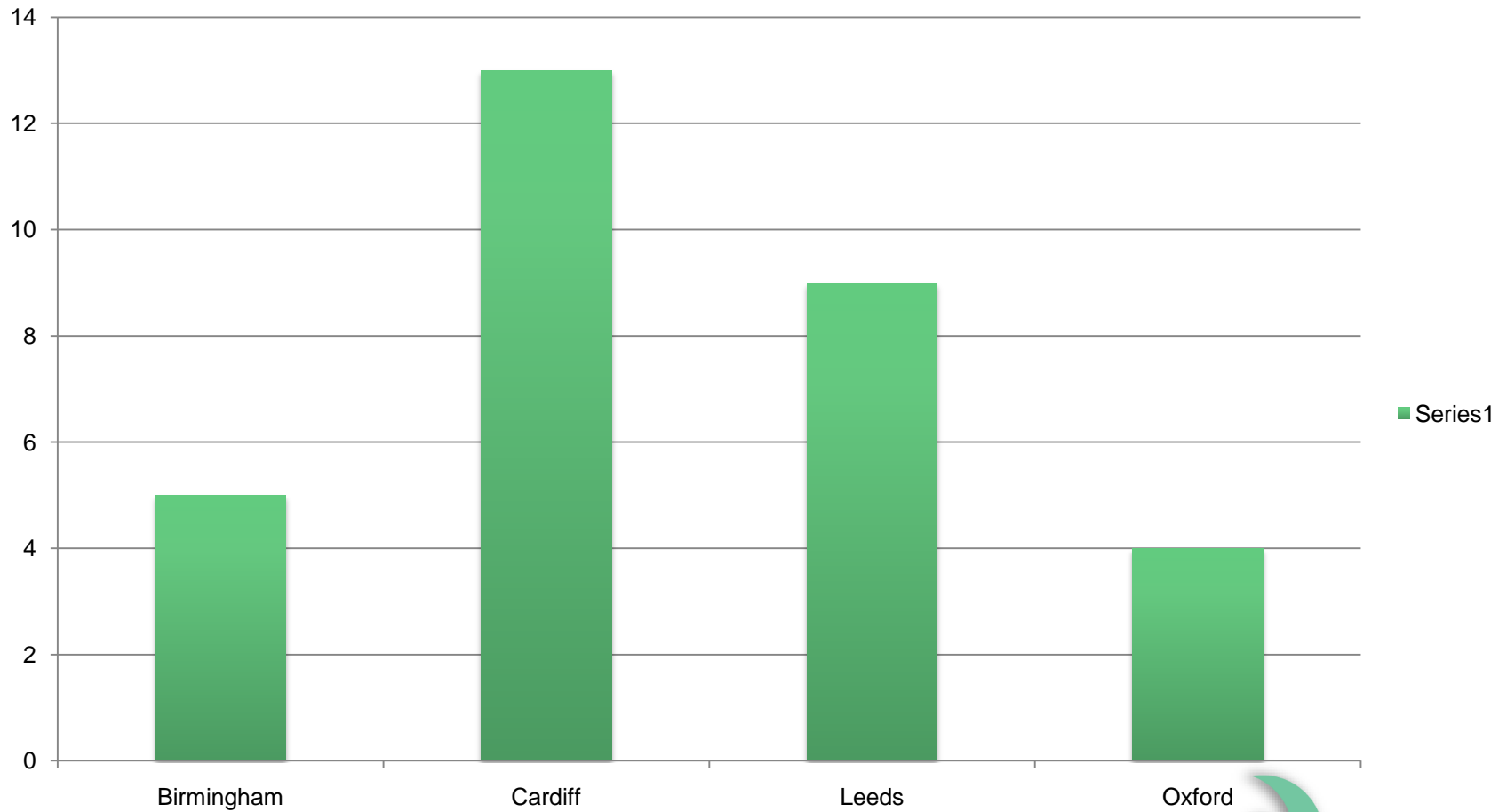
Posts responsible for data entry/resolution



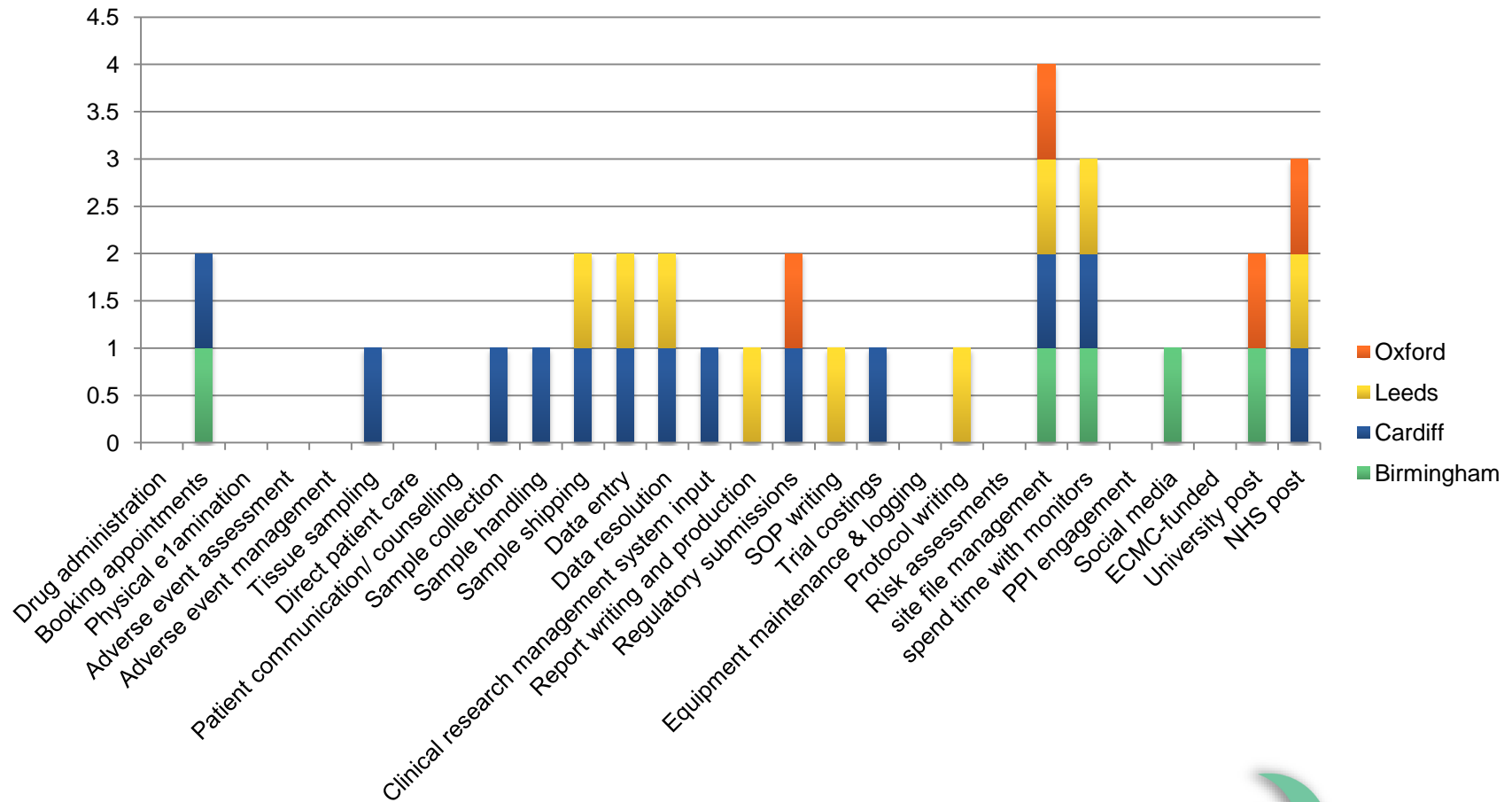

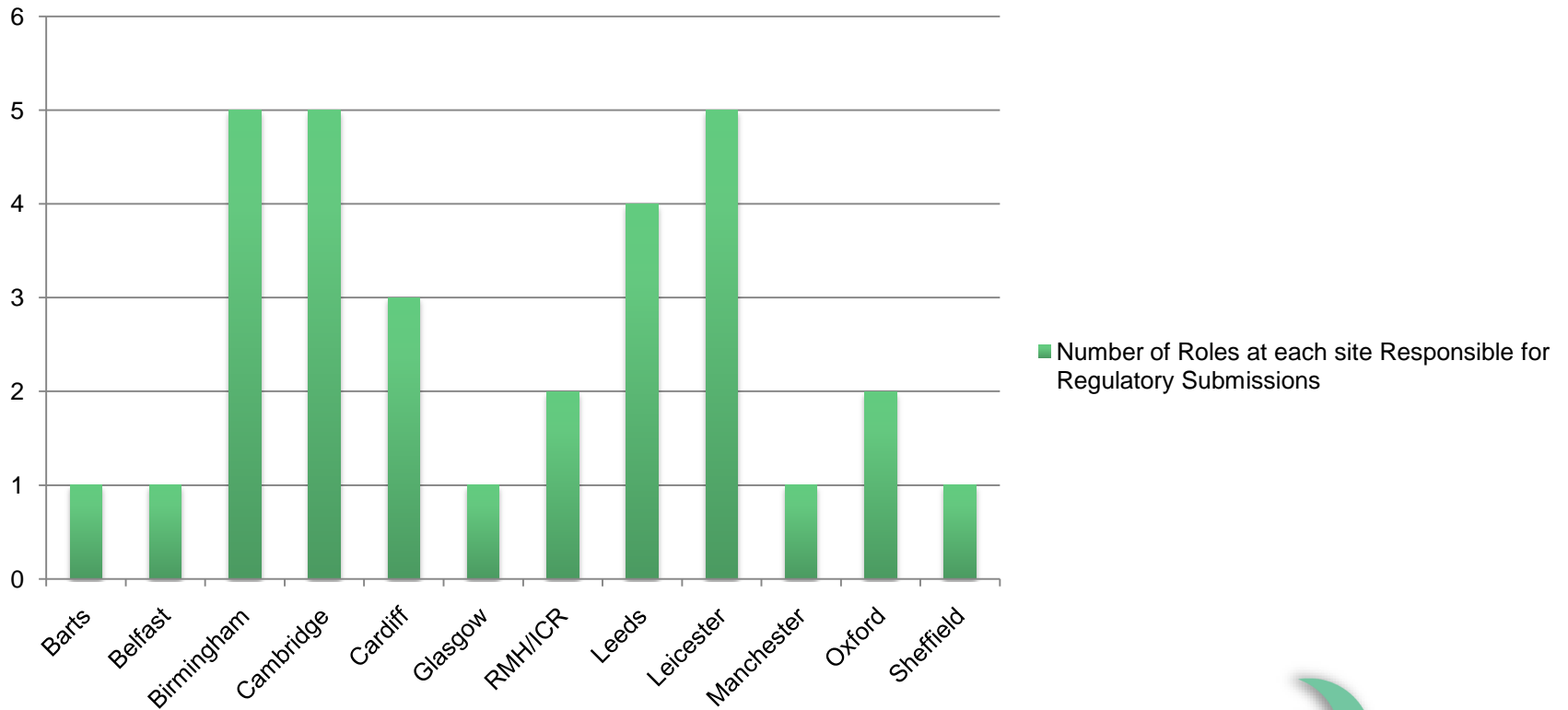


Trial administrator responsibilities

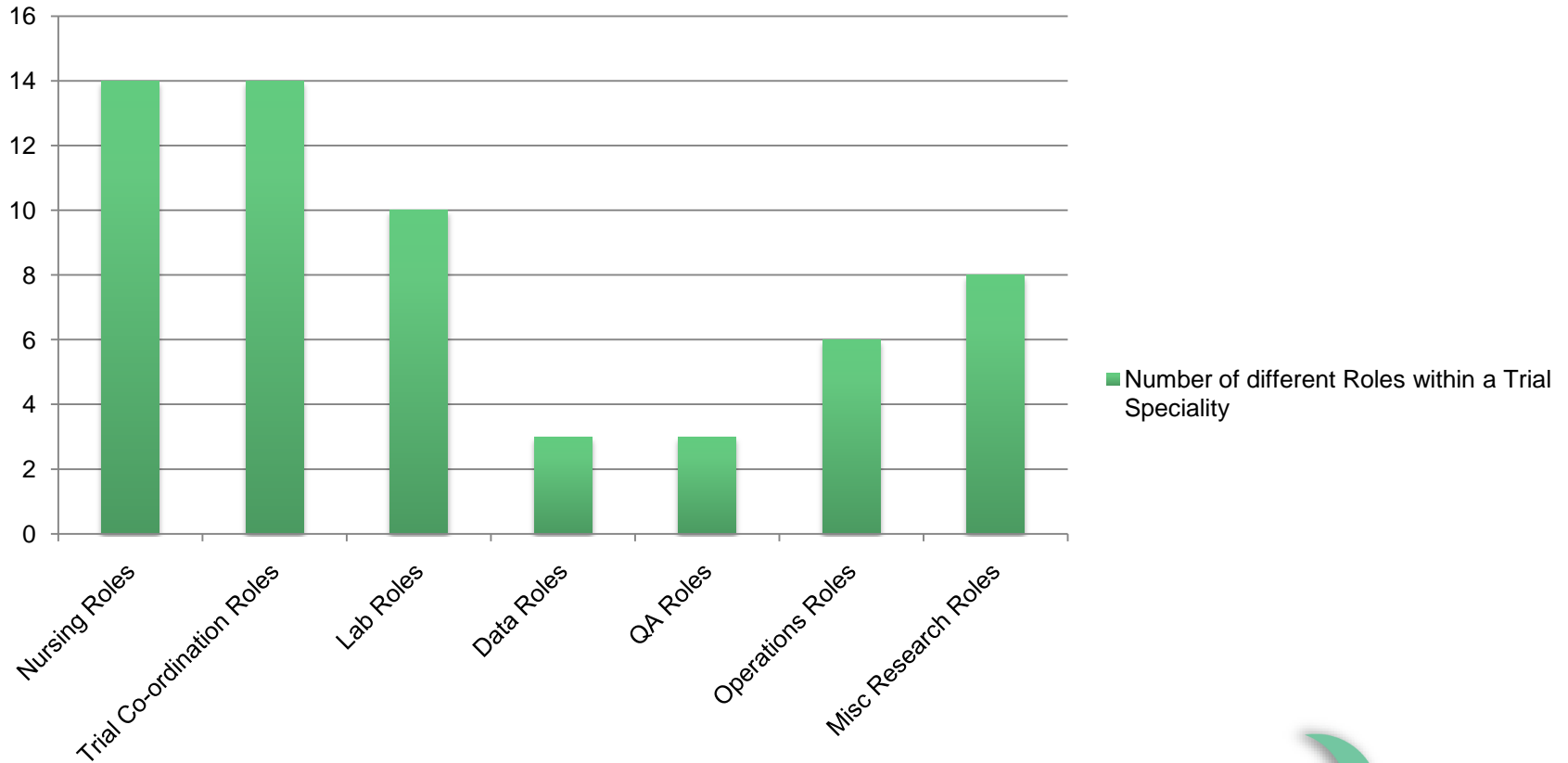


Regulatory Submission
